1ST SOUTH-EAST EUROPEAN CONGRESS OF CHEMICAL ENGINEERING

The 1st South-East European Congress of Chemical Engineering on Chemical and Biochemical Engineering, Environment and Sustainability has been successfully held in Belgrade, Serbia and Montenegro from 25 to 28 September 2005.

The Congress worked through the following sessions:

- General Chemical Engineering;
- Bio, Food and Pharmaceutical Engineering;
- Environmental Engineering;
- Material Science and Engineering;
- Process Engineering;
- Polymers and Interfacial Phenomena.

During these sessions 231 oral and posters contributions were presented by 177 authors representing countries from all over the world. About 60% of the contributions were from the hosting country, 28% from the regional countries, Greece, Romania, Bulgaria, FYR Macedonia, Hungary, Slovenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Croatia and about 12% from other countries: Australia, Austria, Czech

Republik, Canada, France, Germany, Mexico, The Netherlands, UK and USA. The Congress was declared by the European Federation of Chemical Engineers as the 658th event of EFCE.

The plenary lecturers, commenced with Professor Jean-Claude Charpentier, then President of EFCE, and followed by Professor Octave Levespiel, Professor Mike Dudukovic, Professor Gordana Vunjak Novakovic, Professor Richard Turton, Professor Howard Littman and Professor Zeljko Knez, reviewed timely topics and gave the inspirational introduction to the following exchange of scientific information within the sessions and later round tables and informal discussions.

The keynote presentations enabled an overview of the state-of-art in the fields of chemical engineering and chemical technologies in the South-East European countries and together with the contributions presented in sessions, highlighted the possibilities for joint projects and research.

One of the expected outcomes of the Congress was its promotion as a future traditional conference. The Hellenic Association of Chemical Engineers has been proposed for host organizer of the 2nd South-East European Congress of Chemical Engineering which was unanimously accepted.

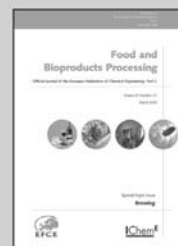
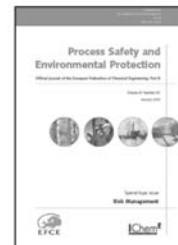
