Please **nominate excellent candidates** for the second workshop in Paris and send the documents of the candidates to your national organisation responsible for food engineering and technology

**before June 30, 2007.**

The **national organisations are requested to select the best candidate and to send their nomination** (large countries may nominate two, a large host country three candidates) to the chairman of the EFCE Section on Food (see [www.efce.info/section/food](http://www.efce.info/section/food))

**before September 15, 2007**

including the following documents: Name, address and CV of the candidate, name and address of the PhD supervisor (including the university and department), the title of the paper and an abstract (max. 400 words) of the suggested presentation.

The basic selection criteria are the following: The candidates should be no older than 35 years and should finish their dissertation in 2007 or in the beginning of 2008. Any subject on food engineering and food technology is welcome, if the work and the results are of outstanding quality. Scientific excellence and a very good presentation of the results are the main criteria for the nomination.
